<u>Internships</u> are an excellent opportunity to learn and gain skills in an organization before committing to a full-time job.

Why you should experience at least one internship in your college career:

- 1. Having more than a high GPA is needed to obtain a job.
- 2. Employers look for experience on a student's resume such as communication, problem-solving and administrative skills, which can be developed through internships.
- 3. VCU can help support you and your internship needs through the Internship Funding Program.

## When to Apply

The hiring process for an internship or entry level position takes **90 days**. Beginning with applications to interviews to offers to onboarding for the new position.

**Key tip:** Start looking for internships the semester before you want one.

When to apply for...
For Summer: Early February
For Fall: May
For Spring: November



How to Find a Internship

- 1. Figure out **what** kind of internship you want for your career. Decide on the type of **experience** you want to obtain.
- 2. Start the **search** process the **semester before** your desired time frame.
- 3. Make sure all of your job application documents are up to date and tailored to the internship you are applying to: **Resume**, **Cover Letter**, online job profile (**Linkedin**, **Handshake**)
  - Visit Career Services located in the Student Commons to have a career counselor look over your documents before you apply.
  - Set up a time to meet with Career Services through Handshake
  - Appointments available between 8 am 5pm Mondays through Friday.
- 4. Attend in-person career fairs
- Visit Handshake to discover when VCU's Career Fairs occur each semester
   Before attending remember to:
  - Research employers
  - Prepare application materials
  - Dress for the job you want
  - Introduce yourself
- 5. Source out ways to fund your internship.

## VCU Internship Funding Program
